Chief Inspector Gamache investigates after a 150-year-old letter points to the discovery and opening of a bricked-up room in an attic that's filled with curiosities




FEBRUARY 15




MARCH 21

very darkest moments of war




JUNE 20




JUJY 18




AUGUST 15




SEPTEMBER 19




OCTOBER 17




NOVEMBER 21
